Chairman Buerkle,
Please consider this email confidential information and not subject to FOIA requests.

I have compiled a few of the documents related to the UL2201 efforts as we discussed the other day. These docs should highlight UL's drive and intention to create an emissions standard based on the request of staff and subsequent involvement. As I said there were barriers put in place that made it very problematic for anyone to pursue a shutoff standard. All of the attachments that I am including should already be available to you since they were all sent to CPSC via Janet's participation on UL2201 or provided by her. The one exception is the UL comment response to the NPR. That is obviously in your database as well though. I have included a short description of each file so you will know what they are.

Also, after our phone call I did some verification checking with some of the PGMA members that are participating on the UL2201 STP. You had asked me how many people I knew of that Janet had called on the STP. As I said I only know of one for certain but others had mentioned to me that she was. You should know that I have not been able to verify that there were any other calls placed from Janet. I did learn that Inez Tannenbaum called many of the UL2201 STP members. I think when some mentioned to me that Janet was calling they may have confused Janet with Inez. I cant say for certain either way. I wanted to share this with you so you would have the full dataset that I have. If there was only the one call I wouldn't want Janet to stand wrongly accused of something she didn't do. I really don't know and have no other means to verify. Either way it doesn't change the concern I have over her influence of the UL2201 activities.
